BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:

The City of Desert Hot Springs implemented a new staff program - Leadership, Education, Action and Development (LEAD).

This program encourages communication, teamwork and creativity between employees and City Departments.

Throughout the course of the program City staff learned more about how each department functions both independently and cohesively. The LEAD team were taught philosophies and strategies for better leadership, public service, and community involvement.

The first LEAD Team began their program on April 3, 2019 and consisted of the following employees:

The first order of business was to elect a Team Leader whose duties were to make sure all members attended the sessions, work with the team to prepare the questions that were going to be asked of Department Directors, and be the liaison between the team and the Assistant City Manager for the community project. The team chose Lynne Paul.

For each session, the team had to prepare two questions that were going to be asked universally and three questions that were tailored to each Director. Each Director then prepared their presentation with these questions in mind. The Departments that gave presentations were:

City Manager Human Resources Assistant City Manager Police Department

Public Works City Clerk

Community Development Deputy City Manager

The team found the presentations very insightful, informative, and fun. Each Director provided their unique approach to leadership which offered insight to how their departments function. It was very interesting to have a glimpse of their personal life while learning about their professional life.

Once the sessions were complete, we began discussions about what we would like to do for a community project. After discussing several ideas, we decided to have an event where we could introduce the residents to City staff and organizations that provide services to them.

Community Night in the Park: Meet Your City was intended to promote interaction and reinforce relationships with the community, City staff, and various local agencies. Our event also included a raffle with a goal of raising money for the Veterans Wall of Honor.
